Sub: Failure to ensure credit of monthly pension on the due date for two consecutive months

Sir,

With great restrain we hereby convey the frustration and discontent among the pensioners wherein their pension for two consecutive months, July and August 2024, have remained unpaid till the last day of the respective months. This, despite our earlier requests to ensure payment of pension by the last day of the month as the delay is happening only after migration to SAMPANN and never once was there any delay when the banks/post offices were doing the job through their CPPCs. [Copy of our letter submitted last month is enclosed]

2. We are not able to understand why this is happening only in respect of pensioners served by some CCAs, this time CCA Kolkata, CCA Tamilnadu, CCA Maharashtra & Goa and CCA Delhi, while all the other CCAs are able to make payment of pension in time. Even in these areas, some were getting their pension credited within the due date, some got it credited only on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2024 and a few are yet to get it credited. Citing technical reasons for the mishap does not look convincing as several CCAs were able to pay the pension on time. Also, any technical issue would not prolong for two months.

3. We would therefore request you to immediately call for reports from the concerned CCAs, make the banks rise to the occasion and take corrective action wherever required, as the pensioners are fast losing faith in the SAMPANN system.

Sub: Failure to ensure credit of monthly pension on the due date

Sir,

We are constrained to say that despite our earlier requests to ensure that monthly pension of BSNL absorbed pensioners is credited to their bank/post office accounts latest by the last day of the month, pension for July 2024 was not credited to the accounts of most of the pensioners till the morning of 1<sup>st</sup> August 2024, with a few complaining about non-credit of pension till now. This has again generated resentment amongst the pensioners, which is flooding the social media groups.

2. While the pensioners are extraordinarily patient in getting their personal details corrected in SAMPANN which had led to non-drawal of pension in several cases and while many bear with the undue delay in sanctioning Family Pension which was never an issue before migration to SAMPANN, the inability by CCAs in ensuring credit of monthly pension on time, has been a matter of botheration, as the pensioners recall how the banks/post offices were doing the job with ease and were crediting pension a few days earlier too.

3. Though the late credit of pension by a day or two may not result in financial stress among all the pensioners, even if a few have scheduled auto-debit of EMIs, card bills etc expecting credit of pension by the last day of the month, this episode mars the sanctity of the system, which has failed to resolve issues for more than a year after migration commenced.

4. We would therefore request you to personally look into the issue and to cause necessary arrangements so that this situation, for whatsoever reason, does not repeat in the future.
