A FEW IMPORTANT ISSUES AT THE MOMENT

The revision of pension of absorbed BSNL pensioners vis-a-vis the pay scale revision of the executives of BSNL w.e.f 1.1.2017 is the most discussed issue now. As it is known that the recommendations of the Third Pay Revision Committee on Pay revision of Board level & below Board level Executives and Non-unionised Supervisors of Central Public Sector Enterprises w.e.f. 1.1.2017 would be implemented without any major changes, all eyes would now be set on BSNL Management as to how and what it proposes for its executives at all levels. With the affordability clause and fitment benefit of 5%, 10% and 15% fitment for different categories of CPSEs remaining as it is and BSNL not falling in any of these categories, the Management will have to find strong arguments to justify 15% fitment benefit to its executives. No doubt, BSNL Management earlier wrote a few letters and even met the DOT Officers and the MOSC supporting 15% fitment benefit to its executives, but now it has to put the detailed proposal in file and get the approval of BSNL Board before sending the same to the administrative Ministry i.e. Department of Telecommunications for final approval. Unfortunately, BSNL had not made any profit during the last so many years, though it made some significant operating profit for last three consecutive years. But according to the guidelines

issued by 3rd PRC, this is not enough for BSNL to allow 15% fitment benefit in normal course. But it will be completely unfair to weigh BSNL in the same scale with other CPSEs because of its role in implementing Government's policies to provide services even in remote areas without looking into profitability. Moreover, even though affordability was one of the parameters set by 2nd PRC for allowing 30% fitment benefit, the said fitment benefit was allowed to the MTNL executives despite the fact that MTNL was a loss making CPSE for years. Thus, extension of 15% fitment benefit to the BSNL executives depends solely on BSNL Management and the Department of Telecommunications. No other party comes in between.

Reserve Bank of India has announced further reduction of repo-rate which may bring down the interests on various loans including home, car, education etc. As a result, the interest rates of different kinds of deposits in Banks/Post Offices will also be reduced. This is where the pensioners do have some serious concern. Therefore, it is necessary that we manage our savings more effectively. If we can invest on long term basis, the Senior Citizen's Savings Scheme and the newly introduced subsidized Pension Scheme called "Pradhan

Mantri Vaya Vandana Yojana” exclusively for the senior citizens with Life Insurance Corporation as the exclusive administrator may come to our help. In the new scheme, assured return is 8% per annum payable monthly (equivalent to Rs. 8.30% per annum). The interest in the form of pension is allowed monthly, quarterly and annually. Those opting for annual pension (interest) would be required to invest less money. Other options should also be considered.

We are committed to seek legal remedy to get the arrears of our revised pay/pension with 78.2% fitment benefit with effect from

1.1.2007. We have started getting response to our request for financial assistance in the case. We shall publish the first list of donors on 16.08.2017 in our website and would update the same periodically. We are not like others who wanted the arrears to be forgotten by advocating for extension of the benefit on “notional” basis and even celebrating the DOT’s Order denying arrears as their “victory”. After the Order was implemented, they said that they would also move to court asking for arrears. Perhaps contradiction is in their blood and thus they increase the woes of the pensioners. ■

AIBSNLREA is now set to seek legal remedy to get the fitment benefit by merger of 78.2% DA with basic pay/pension with w.e.f. 1.1.2007 on actual basis and thereby get all the arrears payable from 1.1.2007 to 9.6.2013 which has been denied by the authorities by terming the fixation benefit as “notional”. This requires engaging renowned and experienced legal experts to appear on behalf of the Association. This would need availability of a strong financial source. This will be possible only with the liberal contribution from the members/well-wishers. GOVERNMENT INTRODUCES A SUBSIDIZED PENSION SCHEME FOR THE SENIOR CITIZENS

Government of India has introduced a subsidized Pension Scheme called “Pradhan Mantri Vaya Vandana Yojana” exclusively for the senior citizens with Life Insurance Corporation of India as the exclusive administrator. Anyone with 60 years of age and above can avail the benefit by single lump sum premium of Rs 1.50,000 (for monthly pension) and maximum of Rs. 7,50,000 which will fetch minimum pension of Rs. 1000 and maximum of Rs. 5000 per month respectively. Pension can be drawn monthly, quarterly, half yearly or on annual basis as per choice. The term of the policy is 10 years. After completion of 10 years period, the invested amount along with final pension installment will be paid. On death of the pensioner during the policy term of 10 years, beneficiary would receive the purchase

price. Assured return of the scheme is 8% per annum payable monthly (equivalent to Rs. 8.30% per annum).

AIBSNLREA TO INFORM PARTICULARS OF PENDING PENSION REVISION CASES TO CCA OFFICE, MAHARASHTRA

AIBSNLREA's had sent representations to DOT and others regarding abnormal delay in the Offices of Pr CCA Maharashtra in settling issuing revised PPOs with fitment benefit by merger of 78.2% IDA for the BSNL pensioners who retired between 1.1.2007 and 9.6.2013. These were forwarded to the CCA, Maharashtra by DOT for appropriate action (view postings dated 08.06.2017 and 25.06.2017 in this website for details). Yesterday, General Secretary, AIBSNLREA was contacted by CCA, Mumbai Office and requested to provide the PPO Numbers etc of those whose cases are not yet settled. GS informed that our Vice President Shri P R Bhujbal would be in touch and supply the necessary particulars. Accordingly Shri Bhujbal has already spoken to the concerned official and it has been decided that we shall wait till 31.07.2017 and the status as on 1.8.2017 will be provided since it was told that many revised PPOs are on the transit. ISSUES TAKEN UP

NON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ORDERS ISSUED FOR THE BENEFIT OF RETIRED BSNL EMPLOYEES BY ALAPPUZHA SSA OF KERALA TELECOM CIRCLE: AIBSNLREA has addressed a letter to Director (HR), BSNL seeking for her intervention since the administration in the Alappuzha SSA of Kerala Telecom Circle is found to be in the habit of not implementing the Orders issued by BSNL Corporate Office for the benefit of retired BSNL employees. The Association has mentioned about two recent orders issued by BSNL Corporate Office vide its No. 2-03/2006-PHA(Pt) dated 9.3.2017 allowing the free night calling facility to the retired BSNL Employees and No. BSNL/Admn.I/15-22/14 dated 11/4/2017 restoring the facility of medical claims for outdoor treatment without vouchers. AIBSNLREA RESPONDS TO THE MESSAGE DATED 6th JULY 2017 FROM DIRECTOR (HR), BSNL REGARDING PAY REVISION OF BSNL EXECUTIVES: Director (HR), BSNL issued one message on 06.07.2017 regarding pay revision of BSNL Executives wherein the efforts being made by BSNL for pay revision of the Executives were explained. The message also conveyed that once the Government approves the PRC recommendations, this is not subjected to any negotiation or bargaining. AIBSNLREA has responded to this message and stated that "We firmly believe that Government cannot and will not keep its eyes closed if some serious aberrations in the matter are raised or come to its notice". The Association has further stated that pay revision with 15% fitment benefit cannot be denied to the BSNL Executives by mere citing of the condition of loss or profit making, since the 2nd PRC recommended revised pay scales with 30% fitment benefit

(highest one) were allowed to MTNL Executives though it was a loss making CPSE for years. Similarly, the Government while accepting the proposal for payment of pension to the MTNL employees by the Government itself had decided that during next pay revision, pay scale parity between MTNL and BSNL employees will be achieved by bringing down the pay scales of the MTNL employees to the level of BSNL employees. As the pay scales of MTNL employees cannot be brought down in reality, the pay scales of BSNL Executives will have to be revised as per 3rd PRC with 15% fitment benefit. RESPONSE TO AIBSNLREA'S REPRESENTATIONS

CCA, MAHARASHTRA REPORTS COMPLETION OF PENSION REVISION WORK: Representations of AIBSNLREA regarding abnormal delay in revision of pension of BSNL pensioners/family pensioners by allowing fitment benefit by merger of 78.2% IDA DA/DR in the Offices of Principal CCA, Maharashtra were earlier forwarded to CCA, Mumbai by the Department of Telecommunications. Now it has been reported in PG portal against PG Docket No. DOTEL/P/2017/0102 and DOTEL/P/2017/00971 that "The work of issue of revised PPO to the pensioners/family pensioners by allowing fitment benefit by merger of 78.2% IDA DA/DR has been completed except some cases with objection pending at BSNL level....". Thus, AIBSNLREA's continuous persuasion with the authorities have borne fruits.

Now the Director of Accounts (Postal), Bihar Circle reports to PEA Branch of Department of Posts, New Delhi that the revised authority for revised

He also informed about the various opinions of other Associations on Pension Revision of BSNL Pensioners, independent of Pay Revision Committee's recommendations of scales and linking it with Pay Commission, etc. He also told that in future there may not be any pay commission since the Government is thinking in quite different way of regulating pay of employees and pensioners on yearly basis depending on inflation rates. We shall have to wait and see. Issues taken up by CHQ with their status were also informed. Other issues of Medical Cards/pending Bills, Medical Allowance for outdoor treatment, Telephone connection linking it with Aadhar and night calling facility etc. He discussed and cleared the doubts raised by the members.

Then Shri Ashok Kulkarni, an Engineer by Profession but a well-studied Historian of Kolhapur, gave a Good informative Lecture on the "Kolhapur Sansthaanika, Maharani Tararani". He was presented flowers and Book. Then the members expressed their views on other issues. Then A S

SDE were elected unanimously as President, Secretary and Finance Secretary of the Madurai Branch respectively. All the members resolved to increase the membership from the present 11, by each member contacting other BSNL retired Executives known to them.
