### CGHS – TOWARDS A CONSCIOUS OPTION

**F**or the third time, BSNL has offered to reimburse the one-time contribution to CGHS on priority basis, making further clear its intent to offload its responsibility of medical care of its retired employees. The retired BSNL employees themselves do not want to continue with BSNLMRS either, given the drastic reduction in limits of reimbursement, non-availability of cashless indoor treatment and lack of accountability on the part of BSNL in reimbursing the medical expenses incurred. As a result, hundreds of BSNL absorbed pensioners, including those residing in non-CGHS areas, keep migrating to CGHS, the Fixed Medical Allowance of Rs.1000 per month being a consolation.

**C**GHS is not new to the BSNL absorbed pensioners. Many of them who resided in CGHS areas were beneficiaries of the Scheme prior to formation of BSNL. After absorption in BSNL we became ineligible to be CGHS beneficiaries. Years later in 2014, BSNL issued an order extending the CGHS facilities to the absorbed BSNL pensioners drawing pension from Central Civil Estimates. Option was allowed to the BSNL pensioners either to remain with BSNLMRS or switch over to CGHS. However, since no decision was taken

regarding one-time subscription to be paid to the CGHS and ward-entitlement of the pensioners for admission in private Hospitals, difficulties were being experienced for its implementation. These issues were taken up by AIBSNLREA with both BSNL and DOT. After consulting Ministry of Health & Family Affairs, DOT first issued an Order in August 2016 instructing therein that PPOs issued to the pensioners getting pension from Central Civil Estimates will mention the equivalent basic pay and grade pay as per Central Pay Scales. It also circulated corresponding mapping of pay and scales from CDA to IDA for deciding the rate of contribution and ward entitlement. Since some practical difficulties were experienced by the Pension Payment Authorities, while implementing this Order, DOT issued another Order in October 2016, stating that the PPOs must explicitly mention corresponding Grade Pay for deciding monthly subscription and corresponding range of pay drawn in Pay Band in CDA for deciding ward entitlement. Meanwhile, BSNL conveyed the decision of the BSNL Management Committee to allow reimbursement of one-time payment made by the absorbed BSNL pensioners to CGHS. Later, DoT in March 2019 circulated an Order of

Department of Health & Family Affairs dated 29.09.2016, on entitlement of the pensioners drawing pension from Central Civil Estimates but residing in non-CGHS areas and making it applicable to BSNL absorbed pensioners. According to this order, pensioners residing in non-CGHS areas can also avail benefits of CGHS (OPD and IPD) by registering themselves in nearest CGHS city centre after making required subscription. They can also have option to avail FMA for OPD treatment and CGHS IPD treatment after making the required subscription as per CGHS guidelines.

**I**t is true that CGHS has seen a lot of improvements since our days in DoT, with recent ones like option to avail CGHS facility from any CGHS wellness centre, transfer of the same CGHS card to other cities when the pensioner shifts residence, special provisions for CGHS beneficiaries above 80 years of age and validity of CGHS card at any wellness centre in India for availing CGHS facilities irrespective of the city where it was registered. Computerisation has reduced the hassles of visiting CGHS offices. MyCGHS App has been launched which provides facilities like tracking medical claims, CGHS card issue status, lodging and following up grievances, medicine history, online appointment system etc. Teleconsultation from the comfort of our homes has been introduced in the name of eSanjeevani, facilitating Audio-Video Consultation with a Doctor and ePrescription, following which the

medicines can be collected at the Wellness Centre. Treatment under Ayurvedic, Siddha and Unani systems of medicine are possible in selected wellness centres.

**B**ut a lot of improvements are still to be made, especially, extending coverage to more cities, increasing the number of wellness centres and adequate staffing of the wellness centres to reduce waiting time, vastly increasing the number of empanelled hospitals, and providing treatment under alternate medicines in most of the wellness centres. Computerization should be aptly utilized for online referral and online approval for investigations and procedures advised by the referral hospitals, so that the aged pensioners are not required to shunt between the hospital and the wellness centres several times. AIBSNLREA has been taking up these issues with the CGHS Directorate and following them up with reminders. With constant and repeated efforts, we hope to get them resolved.

**A**s far as those who reside in non-CGHS areas, AIBSNLREA is pursuing early implementation of the recommendations of a Parliamentary Committee for increasing the Fixed Medical Allowance from Rs.1000 per month to Rs.3000 per month, which is expected to provide some relief. Having lost complete hope in BSNLMRS, CGHS appears to be a forced option for BSNL absorbed pensioners. We will strive to make it a conscious option.●

Pointing out that issue of chargesheet was delayed by three years, conclusion of enquiry took another three years and no final decision has been taken five years after submission of inquiry report, AIBSNLREA has written to CVO BSNL requesting expeditious final decision in the disciplinary case. Since no action has been taken on these suggestions nearly 4 months after the response, AIBSNLREA has again taken up the matter with the Director General, CGHS, requesting early action in order to further strengthen the scheme. **17.11.2022: AIBSNLREA WRITES TO CMD BSNL ON PENSION CONTRIBUTION BY BSNL IN RESPECT OF ITS ABSORBED EMPLOYEES – CLARIFICATIONS REQUIRED BY DOE YET TO BE SUPPLIED BY BSNL:**

Pension contribution by BSNL to the Government in respect of its absorbed employees, at the maximum of the pay scales, continues to remain not only a burden on BSNL finances but also a dampener for moving to the higher 3rd PRC pay scales. DoT vide its letter dated 02.01.2019, had listed five points on which DoE required clarification on the matter and had requested BSNL to get them examined and furnish clarifications to DoT for further deliberation in DoT and onward submission to DoE. While we believed that BSNL had submitted the clarifications and the matter is only pending with DoE, we are shocked to learn through a recent reply from DoT under RTI, that “reply from BSNL is still awaited.” AIBSNLREA has since taken up the matter with CMD BSNL requesting his personal and urgent attention to the issue, clearing any miscommunication between BSNL and DoT on the issue and immediate submission of the required clarifications, if not already submitted. **15.11.2022: AIBSNLREA SEEKS INTERVENTION OF SECRETARY (PENSION) ON THE ISSUE OF GRIEVANCE REGARDING NON-PAYMENT OF MEDICAL CLAIMS OF BSNL RETIREES DESPITE CLEAR INSTRUCTIONS FROM BSNL CORPORATE OFFICE:**

AIBSNLREA has addressed a letter to Secretary (Pension) requesting his intervention, since many retirees are yet to receive payment of their pending bills up to 31.03.2022. Association has pointed out that it earlier brought to the notice of BSNL that “nothing has been done to process the pending medical bills of the retirees in SSAs and other Offices including BSNL Corporate Office to make the payment. Now it is learnt the SSAs even did not correctly inform the liability on this head following which fund allotment was said to be inadequate”. The Association has also pointed out that BSNL Corporate Office had even informed the Association, vide its No. BSNLCO.COMN/12(11)/20/2021-CA-ERP-FICO dated 26.10.2022, about the various actions taken by Corporate Office to clear the pending bills and the existence of several other instructions to mitigate the problems of the retirees. The Association, while seeking his intervention, has conveyed to Secretary (Pension) that “But it is regretted to state that nothing has been done to process the pending medical bills of the retirees in SSAs and other Offices including BSNL Corporate Office to make the payment”. **17.11.2022: DG CGHS ISSUES CLARIFICATIONS REGARDING BILLING BY CGHS EMPANELLED HOSPITALS:**

Directorate of CGHS vide its OM F No.Z/1/2022-DIR(CGHS)-CGHS DEPARTMENT dated 10th November 2022 has reiterated its earlier clarifications and further clarifies that the empanelled hospitals shall not prepare two separate bills for the same period of treatment i.e., one separate bill to claim payment from CGHS/Department and another to be paid by the beneficiary. #### 08.11.2022: CLARIFICATION REGARDING INTEREST ON DELAYED PAYMENT OF COMMUTED VALUE OF PENSION:

DoP&PW vide its OM No.42/15/2022-P&PW(D)7 dated 31st October 2022 has clarified that in cases where the CVP is paid after retirement, the reduction of the amount of commuted pension from the monthly pension becomes operative from the date on which CVP is paid. As per Rule 10A of CCS (Commutation of Pension) Rules, the commuted amount is restored on completion of fifteen years from the date of reduction of pension on account of commutation becomes operative in accordance with Rule 6. Since the pension continues to receive full pension till the date of payment of CVP, the question of payment of any interest on delayed payment of commutation of pension does not arise.
